### Is your property fire-safe?

- Cut back any overhanging trees or shrubs and dispose of cuttings appropriately.
- Check the condition of your roof and replace any damaged or missing tiles.
- Clean leaves from the roof, gutters and downpipes and fit quality metal leaf guards.
- Non-combustible fences are the most effective at withstanding the intense heat generated by bushfire.
- Plant trees and shrubs that are less likely to ignite due to their low oil content.
- If you have a water tank, dam or swimming pool, consider installing a State Water Supply sign (SWS).
- Enclose sub-floor areas.
- Store wood piles well away from the house and keep covered.
- Keep garden much away from the house and keep grass short.
- Make sure the pressure relief valves on LPG cylinders face outwards.
- Ensure you have a hose which is long enough to reach every part of the home.
- Remove and store any flammable items away from the house.
- Install metal fly-wire or solid screens to the outside windows and doors.
- Have a non-combustible doormat.

### LEGEND

- Asset Protection Zone (APZ)**  
An area between a bushfire hazard and buildings or other structures that is kept clear of bushfire fuels and obstructions to firefighting (also known as a Fire Break).
- Strategic Fire Advantage Zone (SFAZ)**  
An area in which vegetation types that affect fire spread and intensity are deliberately reduced through methods such as burning or grazing.
- Land Management Zone (LMZ) Prescribed Burn**  
An area in which prescribed burning is currently scheduled to reduce bushfire fuel and provide optimum conditions for biodiversity.
- Transport Corridor Fire Break (TCFB)**  
An area alongside road or rail corridors in which bush fire fuel is reduced to lower ignition potential and limit fire spread.
- Linear Fire Break**  
A linear area in the landscape in which vegetation is reduced to provide a barrier to slow or stop the spread of bush fire.
- Resident Preparation Area**  
An area in which residents prepare themselves and their property for fire.
- Fire Trail**  
A road specifically built for the purpose of accessing a property or area for fire management activities such as building containment lines or backburning operations during a bushfire.
- Bushfire Neighbourhood Safer Place**  
A place of last resort for bushfire shelter
